 but vocabulary is arbitrary.


 Prescriptivists & Descriptivists are

Were your fellow students able to guess your meanings? Why or why not?


The Problem of Meaning

Prospero: "Our little life is rounded with a sleep." - The Tempest




WHAT'S IT MEAN?
